



Village issues \$4.71 mil in bonds for Sanctuary PID #1

Village of Salado aldermen at their June 6 meeting authorized the issuance of \$4.71 million in Village of Salado Special Assessment Revenue Bonds Series 2024 for Sanctuary East Public Improvement District Improvement Area #1 Project.

Chris Lane, financial advisor for the Village, discussed the issuance with aldermen. Representatives from the bond underwriting group and bond counsel for the Village were also on hand.

“The debt is solely the responsibility of those living in the Public Improvement District,” Lane said. “Bonds

were sold on a limited offering. Your mom and pop investors cannot purchase these bonds.”

“We approved the transaction pending board approval tonight,” Lane said in response to a question from Bell.

The bond is on a 10-year call, meaning that they cannot be refunded during the first 10 years of the bond lifetime of 30 years. The bonds are financed at 6.7%. The first year’s interest payment on the \$4.71 million bond at 6.7% is \$315,570.

Alderman Jasen Graham made the motion to approve Ordinance 2024-07 concerning the issuance of the bonds. Alderman Zach Hurst gave a second. Motion

passed 4-0.

Aldermen approved Ordinance 2024-05, which provides for the imposition of a lien on an owner’s property other than homestead or rental property, for delinquent bills for utility (sewer) services. The motion was made by Alderman Michael MacDonald with a second by Graham, passing unanimously.

After a 20 minute discussion, the board approved waiving the \$50 food vendor fee for the Scottish Gathering and Highland Games in November. MacDonald made the motion, which received a second from Hurst. Mayor Pro Tem Rodney Bell joined MacDonald and Hurst in voting in favor. Graham

abstained from voting as Vice President of Salado Museum board and co-chair of event.

The board held the first reading of Ordinance 2024-06 providing for regulation of camping within the Village limits.

The board held the first reading of an Ordinance 2024-08 repealing and replacing Ordinance 2017.07 establishing regulations relating to the sale and consumption of alcoholic beverages within the village limits.

Aldermen authorized a change in the Tourism Department from two full-time positions to one full-time position and two part-time positions. The motion was

made by Graham, receiving a second from Hurst. It passed unanimously.

Aldermen authorized the addition of one full-time employee to the Police Department. The addition will increase the current budget by \$11,200. The salary position will add \$58,000 to the budget. The new position will bring the police department to nine officers. The motion was made by MacDonald, second from Bell. It passed unanimously.

Aldermen authorized the lease-purchase of a 2024 Chevy Silverado PPV for \$53,280, with upfitting for \$22,528 and the immediate purchase of a 2021 Chevy Tahoe for \$54,448.94. The lease-purchase will be paid

out in three yearly payments of \$28,680 with a final buy out of \$1. Current vehicles are 2011 Ford F-150 with 146,000 miles; 2018 Ford F-150 with 78,000 miles; 2020 Chevy Tahoe with 56,000 miles; 2020 Chevy Tahoe with 70,000 miles; 2022 Dodge Durango, 16,000 miles; 2022 Dodge Durango, 4,000 miles.

Aldermen voted unanimously to leave the vacant alderman position empty until May 2025. Aldermen Hurst made the motion; MacDonald gave a second.

Aldermen changed the maximum time limit from three to five minutes for Citizen Communications

Aldermen canceled their July 4 meeting.

Masons honor Prater as Community Builder

“If you drive anywhere in Salado,” Chris Fowler said, “you will see her work, right there by the side of the road.”

Fowler, who is the Master of Salado Masonic Lodge #296, was speaking of Tommye Prater. Salado Masonic Lodge #296 presented Prater with the Community Builder Award during a luncheon at the Salado Civic Center on June 8.

The Community Builder Award was designed by the Grand Lodge of Texas to enable local Masonic Lodges to recognize outstanding non-Masons who have distinguished themselves through their service to the community, government, church or synagogue or to humanity. It seeks out those men and women who year in and year out quietly and without fanfare show devotion to their community and its people without the expectation of recognition.

Many lodges present this award annually, but Salado Lodge rarely presents it. It has been almost a decade since it was last presented.

Prater’s name joins a short list that includes Melanie Kirchmeier (2015), Hulda Horton, the late Bob Cottle, and the late Denver Mills as honorees.

Prater has been active in the Salado Ladies Auxiliary (now Salado Ladies Community League) since arriving in Salado. She chaired the Christmas in October event for 12 years. This is

the largest fund-raiser for the Ladies League, raising tens of thousands of dollars that are contributed back into the community through donations to efforts such as Heart and Hands Ministries, Salado Family Relief Fund, Salado Museum and others.

“Because of this annual event, the Ladies Auxiliary has given dozens of scholarships to graduating Salado seniors,” Fowler said. “These worthwhile efforts would not be possible if not for the countless hours Tommye spent each year working with local businesses in planning the weekend event.”

“Tommye is an integral part of the Salado Six, which includes Tommye, Joe Oliver, Don Hogue, Mel Williams, the late Hans Fields and our own Salado Lodge Brother Roy Harden,” Fowler said. “They volunteer time to maintain the landscape of public spaces and rights of way throughout the Village, including Sherrill Park on Salado Creek and

the entrance to Mill Creek at Main St. and the entrance to the village where we put our circle of flags.”

The Salado Six were the winners of the 2017 Keep Texas Beautiful Awards for Civic Organization Award.

Prater was named the Citizen of the Year by the Salado Chamber of Commerce in 2014.

In 2021, she was named an Environmental Ambassador by the Centex Sustainable Communities Partnership encompassing Fort Cavazos and municipalities in Bell and Coryell Counties.

“You will see her along the Salado creek at Sherrill Park, weed eater in hand as her friend Joe Oliver is behind the wheel of the mower,” Fowler said. “Tommye volunteers 20 hours a week to beautifying the public spaces of the place she calls home.”

“Speaking of the creek, Tommye is the benefactor who flies the flags at Salado

Salado Museum, College Park celebrate 65th

Salado Museum and College Park is celebrating its 65th Anniversary with an Open House on June 20, beginning at 4:30 p.m., at 423 South Main in Salado.

The community is invited to stop by to enjoy refreshments, music and fellowship and to share their memories of the museum over the past 65 years.

The celebration continues at 6 p.m. with a special program about the early days of

the museum and the history of Salado that will include music, videos and storytelling. The main museum exhibit room will be open for visitors to enjoy. Refreshments will be served and the program will take place in The Lucile A. Robertson Center, named for the museum’s founder.

Members of Mrs. Robertson’s family and Salado city officials will be in attendance to greet and visit with

guests.

“The people of Salado owe a huge debt of gratitude to Lucile Robertson. It was her vision and determination that saved the ruins of Salado College and many artifacts of Salado pioneers,” says Lynette McCain-Jones, Salado Museum Executive Director. “She was an inspiration, a guiding light and a driving force who made a tangible difference to this community.”

The museum opened in 1959 as the Central Texas Area Museum. Mrs. Robertson served as its executive director from its inception until her death in 1997.

The museum became Salado Museum and College Park in 2017 when it merged with the Robertson Colony-Salado College Foundation.

Mrs. Robertson also founded the annual Gathering of the Scottish Clans in Salado in 1961 which cel-

brates its 63rd year this November and is the oldest Scottish festival in Texas.

Mrs. Robertson’s husband was a descendant of Major Sterling C. Robertson, an empresario whose land grants brought hundreds of families to settle in this area, and his son, Col. E.S.C. Robertson, who donated 100 acres of land to establish Salado College and the town of Salado.

U.S. adds 272,000 jobs in May; 2.8 mil more people employed than a year ago

The Markets

Our dearly beloved S&P 500 Stock Index (SPX) continued its weekly rise to new and previously unknown and oft considered impossible heights this week, heading into the weekend at 5346.99, up 1.32% for the week. It is now 12.10% higher than where it started the year, up 25.30% from a year ago, and ahead 26.51% in the last three years. Along the way, the Magnificent 7 stocks that were producing almost all the growth in the index have been reduced to the Fabulous Five, NVIDIA, Microsoft, Amazon.com, Meta, and Alphabet, as Apple and Tesla have fallen by the wayside and declined. Those five stocks, representing 1% of the stocks listed in the index, now constitute about 27.5% of the value represented by the SPX. The performance of the other 95% can be suggested in our experience by the CRSP US Mid Cap Value Index. That Index fell 1.69% for the week, to 2604.28, leaving it up 3.89% this year and 12.17% from one year ago.

On the other side of the financial markets the now 18 month long severe inversion in the Treasury Yield Curve continued. The benchmark 10-year U.S. Treasury 10-year note ended the week yielding 4.43% as it continued its gradual and often overlooked rise in rates. Down on the short end of the curve, the 3-month Treasury bill held the lead amongst interest bearing securities with an annualized yield of 5.52% while the 30-year Treasury bond was paying only 4.55%. West Texas Intermediate crude oil (WTI) ended the U.S. Market week at \$75.30 per barrel in its very pleasant to summer drivers decline in price. It may be worth remembering that ten years ago a barrel of that black, smelly stuff was selling for \$104.

Caveat Emptor

Before we move on into The Economy, we think it is important to issue a warning. As we attended a con-

ference this week, we heard a lot about the number of public investors moving into “Alternative Investments.” A recent article in the Wall Street Journal’s “Intelligent Investor” by Jason Zweig highlighted the dangers there. It is easy to buy into “Alts” as they are called, and they are sold as investments that can stabilize the value of a portfolio. The problem is that an investment is always and only worth what you can sell it for. Alternative investments, even those advertised as “liquid alternatives” have severe limitations on releasing money back to the investor. As Mr. Zweig pointed out, in many cases the only way to “sell” your shares or interests in “Alts” is to a third-party purchaser at a 30% to 50% discount to the published “net asset value.” In years gone by we have witnessed surges of such investment products and we have seen many portfolios with them. What we have never seen is an investor who turned a profit on “non-traded” alternative investments, while we have seen many who lost all, much, or most of their invested money in such offerings. Alts are like the Hotel California; you can check out any time you want but, in our experience, often, you can never leave.

The Economy

If you were hoping, as has been the popular pastime for the past year or so, that the economy will soon enter a recession and thereby force the Federal Reserve to quickly lower interest rates, you probably were severely disappointed this week. The Labor Department’s Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) reported that total nonfarm payroll employment in the U.S. increased by 272,000 in May, higher than the 12-month average of 232,000 despite

the unemployment rate rising from 3.9% to 4.0% as more workers entered the jobs market. To put that in perspective, there are now 2,784,000 more people employed in the U.S. than a year ago and they are averaging 34.3 hours per week at an average weekly wage of \$1,197.41. Total all that out, and those workers are earning \$173.3 billion more than was being earned, and mostly spent, a year ago. That alone amounts to a growth in productive income of 1.73% in one year. Add in the fact that average real (inflation adjusted) wages are up by about 2.27% from a year ago and it becomes easy to see why the U.S. economy is growing. Of course, it takes more than increased earnings to drive GDP forward. Those 168 million full-time employed workers have also increased their productivity by a whopping 12% more than their increase in wages over the last year. These numbers strongly suggest that we are in a massive economic expansion.

To add injury to insult for those pleading for a recession to arrive, the Institute for Supply Management announced on Thursday that the U.S. Business Activity Index stood at 61.2 on a scale where numbers above 50 indicate economic expansion, while the Services Purchasing Managers’ Index rose to 53.8 from April’s 49.4, suggesting more growth to come. Even that one-month contraction we saw in April was the only dip below 50 in the past year and a half or so.

We may sound like a broken record as we repeat the news, but the U.S. economy remains in growth mode and is thundering ahead at about the fastest pace an economy of this size can grow.

Voucher scheme robs Texas’ public schools

It wasn’t very long before private schools began to pop up with a tuition cost that not many could afford.

Now Governor Abbott and his minions have come up with a new approach: voucher schools supported by State-granted vouchers which public school students can use to “escape” public school. Not only is this plan a kind of segregation at base, it will also

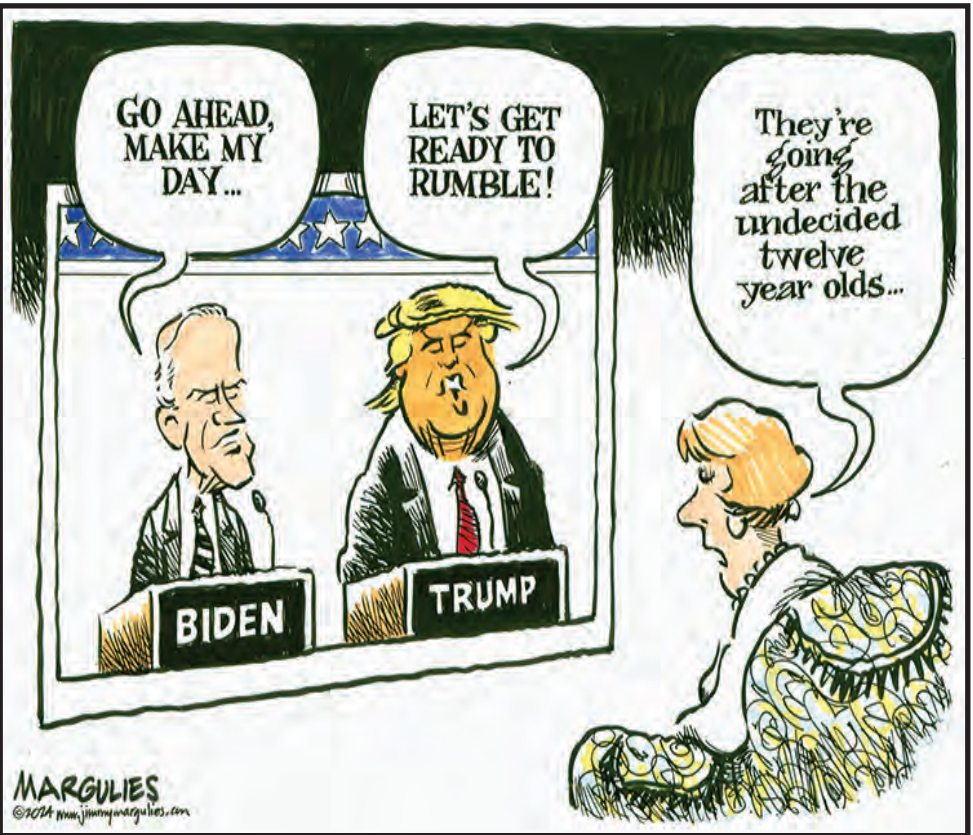

SHS smallest 4A school in top 10 for UIL Lone Star Cup

The UIL Lone Star Cup is awarded annually to six high schools, one in each of the six UIL classifications (1A, 2A, 3A, 4A, 5A and 6A), based on their team performance in district and state championships. The winning schools in each classification will receive the UIL Lone Star Cup trophy and a \$1,000 scholarship. 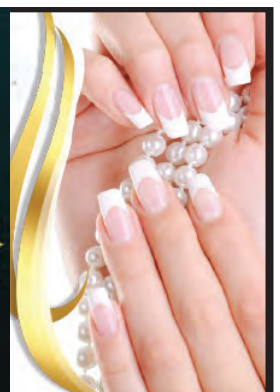

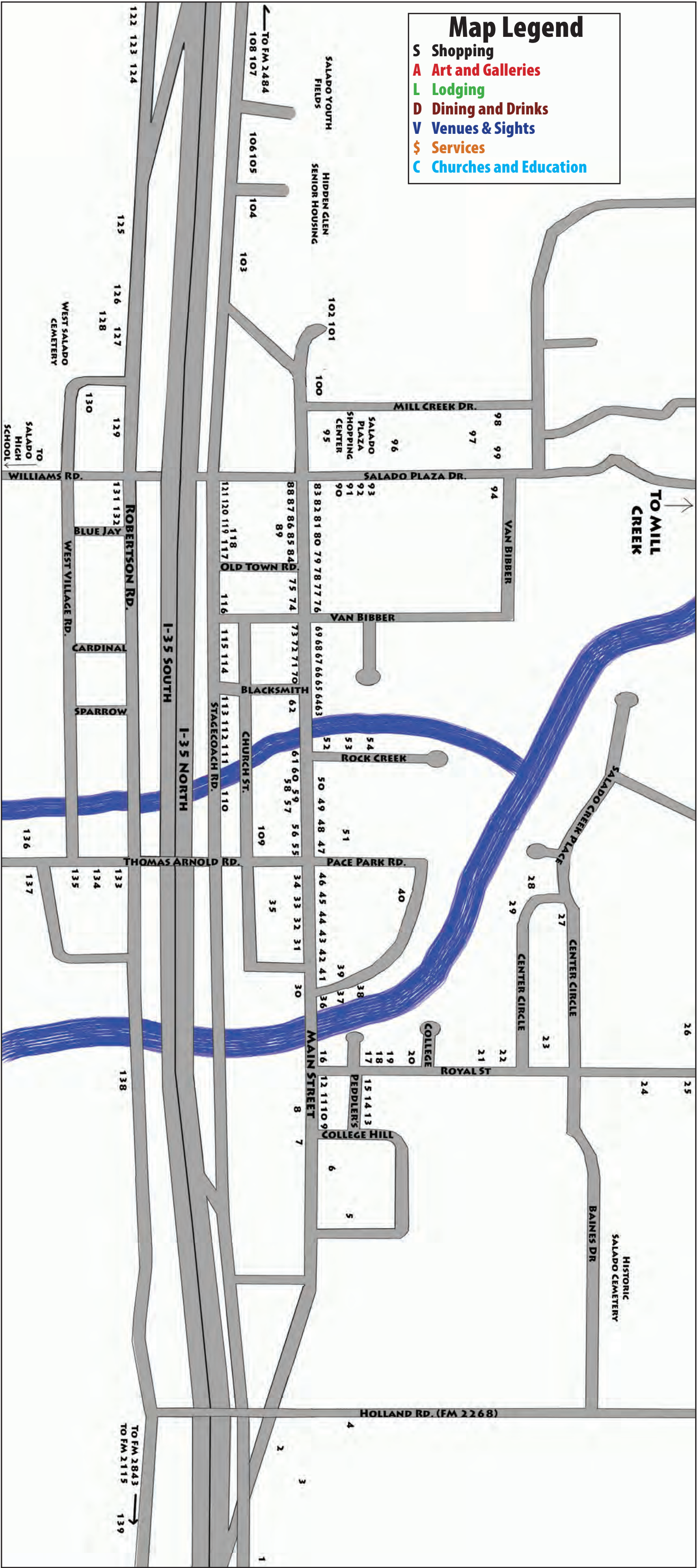
