

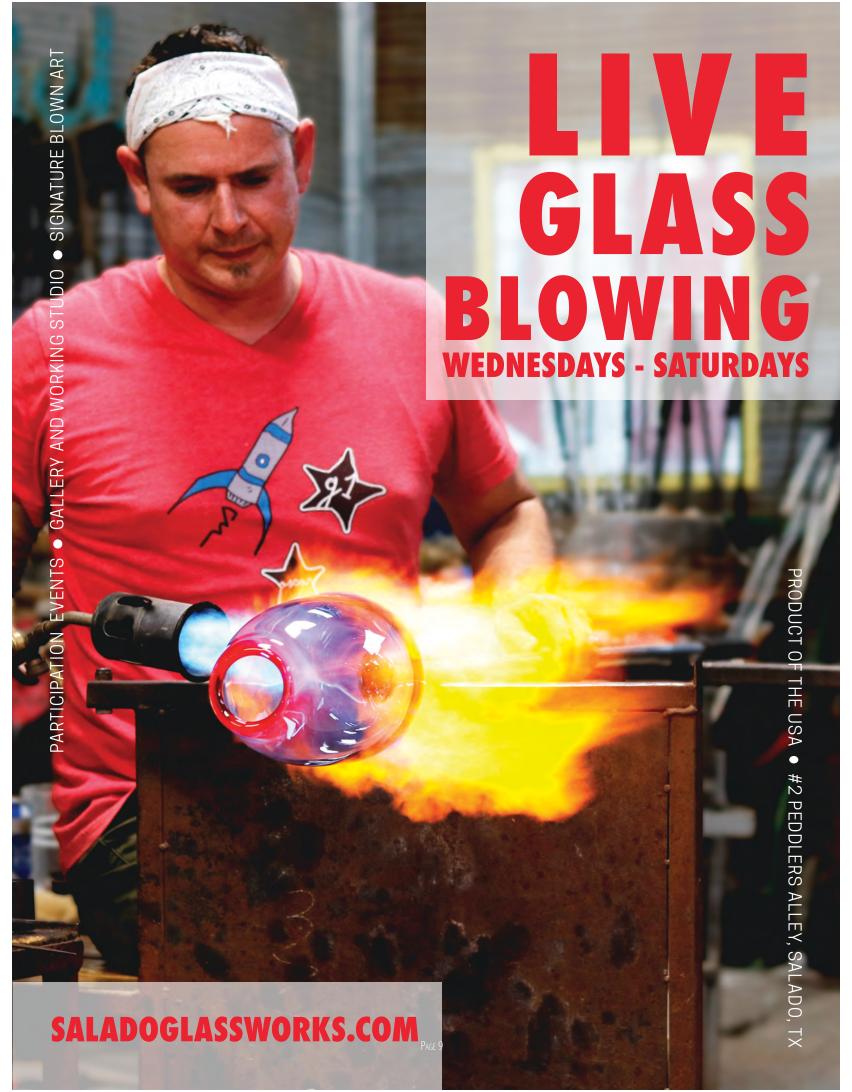

## Barbecue October 12 benefits Bogey Free Club

In a show of community spirit and appreciation to our country's heroes, Legacy Protection & Preservation, a local family business and financial firm, is hosting their annual BBQ lunch Saturday, October 12 to raise funds for the non-profit organization, Bogey Free Club. The event, held at Barrow Brewing Company, will bring together local business leaders, veterans, and community members in a shared mission to support those who have served and sacrificed for the nation.

Bogey Free Club is a 501(c)(3) non-profit organization that introduces adaptive sports to veterans and wounded warriors to help improve their overall health and wellness. Adaptive sports play a crucial role in the lives of veterans and wounded warriors, offering numerous physical, emotional, and social benefits. They have a holistic approach to recovery and integration helping more veterans and wounded warriors lead active, engaged and fulfilling lives. One of their annual events, Save Our Soldiers, is coming up in November and is hosted to help bring awareness to adaptive sports for PTSD relief and suicide prevention. They also coordinate with Soldier Recovery Units

(SRU) from across the country to bring ill, injured and disabled active-duty soldiers to Central Texas for an introduction and competition in multiple adaptive sports and activities.

Ft. Campbell, KY SRU Coordinator, Robyn Fortin, will be bringing soldiers for her third year in a row to Bogev Free Club's events in November on what they call a "Texas Tour". Robyn has remarked, "Thanks to their efforts, hundreds of Soldiers are introduced to the sport of disc golf each year. Many of the Soldiers who go through our supported Bogey Free Club disc golf program tend to find not just a physical outlet in their recovery but also a mental and emotional one. Before their injuries, most of the Soldiers had never played disc golf but now consider it an activity that will serve them in their recovery for the rest of their lives, thanks to Bogey Free Club!"



"Supporting our veterans and wounded warriors is not just a duty, but a privilege," said Legacy Protection & Preservation CEO, Wayne Womac, during his remarks on this event. "We come together as a community to honor their bravery and ensure they receive the support they deserve."

At the BBQ, a \$20 donation provides a two-meat plate with three sides, drink, and a dessert along with a free raffle ticket. A highlight of the event will be a free introduction to disc golf, which is one of the adaptive sports that has made the biggest impact at their nonprofit. A Bogey Free Club instructor will direct participants on a disc golf putting game called Ring of Fire, and they will be handing out disc golf related prizes for the winners to explore their enjoyment of that adaptive sport.

Bogey Free Club's Co-Founder and Marine Corps veteran, Thomas Stricklin, expressed gratitude, saying, "This kind of community support is invaluable. The funds raised at this BBQ will help us expand our programs and reach more veterans and wounded warriors in need."













# Scottish Gathering & Highland Games

The 63rd Salado Scottish Gathering and Highland Games will be held November 8-10 at the Thomas Arnold Elementary School grounds in Salado, Texas. Heralding all things Scottish, this landmark event is the oldest Scottish festival in Texas and has been sponsored continuously by the Salado Museum since 1961. All proceeds from the three-day event benefit the museum, a 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization (saladomuseum. org).

The weekend's activities include bagpipe bands, athletes Tossing the Caber, Highland dancing, Celtic musicians, the popular Bonniest Knees Contest, Dog Costume Contest, a Celtic marketplace, food trucks, and more. The Clan Village is the largest gathering of Scottish Clans in Texas where members from 40 clans share information on Scottish history and genealo-

gy. (saladoscottishfestival.com)

Events begin on November 8 include a musical history presentation by Scottish singer and folklorist, Ed Miller at 1 p.m. in the Salado Museum with a suggested donation at the door.

The Calling of the Clans torchlight ceremony is held at 6 p.m. on the banks of Salado Creek just north of the museum and is open free to the public. A ticketed Social follows at the museum.

Festival grounds are open November 9 from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. Opening ceremonies are held at noon with the Bands and Clans Parade and a massed bands presentation. The parade starts at Main Street and North Pace Park Road and moves west on Thomas Arnold Road to the festival grounds. The day's activities include live Celtic music by Scottish singer Ed Miller and Scottish fiddler Colin MacLeod


## Barbecue dinner, cornhole tourney at Chapel at Caliber Oak on October 6 benefit Pearl's Place


The Tinplate Trackers of Austin, Texas is a 3-rail O-Gauge Model Train Club located in the Austin area. The club participates in a number of model railroading activities and events in Central Texas.

The Tinplate Trackers are people who enjoy the operation of O-gauge tinplate trains on modules that are basically standardized, yet open to unlimited improvisation. The largest layout created by members was 40 feet by 60 feet.

Tinplate refers to toy trains and track — such as American Flyer, Marx and Lionel — built before World War II, when they were actually made of metal. However, toy trains built today are mostly plastic but the tinplate rails still remain. Tinplate trains are larger than most scale model trains and are lots of fun.

A module is a unit, a short section of railroad, built to standard specifications so that it can be joined with other such units to form



many clubs, which is made up of a number of units which assemble in only one way. The Tinplate Tracker modules, made in a few basic types, can be assembled in many, many different ways.

# Posada recreates journey of Joseph and Mary

Las Posadas, the nine day Christmas tradition observed in Spain, Mexico and the Southwest United States, will be celebrated as La Posada, a one day event, in Salado during the community's Christmas Stroll. La Posada will be from 5:30-8:30 p.m. Saturday, December 14. The public is invited to take part.

The Spanish term means inn, place of lodging or accommodations. In some ways the spirit of Las Posadas is similar to the English custom of caroling.

It dates back 400 years in Mexico and recreates the journey of Joseph and Mary to Bethlehem.

Each year the same drama is played out. Though thoroughly rehearsed, what will happen will seem fresh and exciting to the young people taking part. Dressed in period clothing, they will begin at the gate to the old ruins on College Hill and then lead a candle light procession down Main Street a distance of two miles. Along the way they will stop to ask for lodging and a place to rest.

Of course there is no room at any inn until they reach St. Joseph's Episcopal Church. There, too, The Reverend Lynn Osgood will apologize at first for the lack of lodging.

Then The Reverend Lynn Osgood will have a thought. She will lead the couple to a stable behind the church. There she will offer to settle them in for the night in mounds of hay.

Participants are members of St. Joseph's Youth Group and Spanish language students from Belton High School. They spend weeks practicing the para pedir posada (searching for lodging) in a call and response chorus. Barbara Yanez-Smith, a Spanish language teacher, gave a loose translation of the words. The first chorus asks for a place to rest: "Let me in, my wife is Maria, she is the Queen of Heaven."

The second chorus responds, "Well, if she is the Queen of Heaven why is she out in the middle of the night wandering about?"

At the final destination there is unison of choruses.

"Entren santos peregrinos – come on in, we had not recognized you – we now see you're Jose and this is your wife Maria."



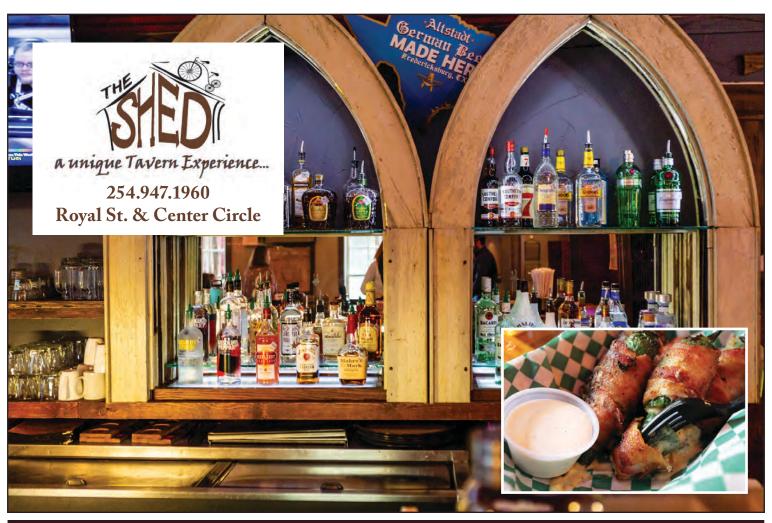
